Double Groundbreaking

September 8, 2021 Habitat for Humanity of East and Central Pasco County (HFHECPC) hosted a double groundbreaking ceremony for two homes on Church Avenue. Bellvis Hooks and Sonja Wenzel both had their homes dedicated Wednesday afternoon. Joining them were Habitat staff, family and friends.

"We are so happy to start building these two homes," said Crystal Lazar, CEO and President of HFHECPC. "They are the final homes in this five home neighborhood in downtown Dade City. These families have worked very hard to have the opportunity to become homeowners and we are so proud of how far they have come."

Bellvis Hooks and her four children acknowledged that this has been a long journey but they are so encouraged by the progress that the groundbreaking represents. The family has worked together to finish their sweat equity hours and are excited to finally be able to work on their own home.

"This has been a long process," said Hooks. "But I have continued to work through it all and am very grateful to become a Habitat homeowner."

Sonja Wenzel brought her family to the groundbreaking so they could see where their new home will be located. The younger children were more interested in the big pile of dirt on the job site but watching the home becoming a reality is something Habitat hopes becomes a cherished memory.

Standing in the quiet residential neighborhood, Wenzel's son Kenneth remarked "I really like this area. I can't wait to move in here and make it our home."

COVID-19 has slowed down the supply chain and made many areas of volunteering more difficult, but HFHECPC has continued to build affordable homes in Pasco County. Two additional homes are close to completion and Habitat hopes to dedicate them in the fall.


